### Principal's report

- SCSD partnership with Police Department for Police and Me program: police officers met with 5th grade students to de-stigmatize police
- SCSD partnership Office of Family Engagement with Police Department: police met with 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders on school safety; will present to upper grades in January
- Home to school contract will be sent out to all families; contract is an annual commitment to share information on how Title I funds are spent
- Upcoming Office of Family Engagement event on Sat. Dec. 23: Free bicycle giveaway
- Office of Social Security Administration donated laptops and devices: administration is working to identify high need families to be distributed prior to winter break
- Lockdown drill occurred on early release day and was communicated by district
- Accountable Talk staff professional development underway: moves towards model of teacher as facilitator to encourage students to engage more deeply; model stems from panorama surveys from last year where students asked for more opportunities for collaboration; Centered on 3 buckets:
  - Accountable to the community: building classroom community that is safe for all students to share their thoughts
  - Accountable to the knowledge (content) where students are demonstrating their understanding across subjects
  - Accountable to reasoning where students encouraged to develop higher-level evaluative skills
- Teachers and students monitoring goal-setting, ongoing
- Ashley Kennard: continue to hear from families that kids are not going out for recess (long-term concern); one reason cited was lack of winter gear—PTO closet has an abundance of winter gear if that is an issue; what can we do?
  - K-5 recess built into curriculum
  - o 6-8 recess opportunities increasing after voicing concerns
  - o Ms. Ellis will look into issues (gear, personnel, etc.)

# **Mary Juman**

- Teaches pre-K through 5 general music + 6-8 chorus; 6-8 also offered orchestra and band program through music team; Ms. Juman's 5<sup>th</sup> year at Ed Smith
- Foundational pieces were missing from Ms. Juman's K-12 music education: comes from growing up in small town in Mohawk Valley without the foundational pieces
  - Equity piece is very important (learned this from 22 years of experience at Dr. Weeks) – all kids must have the same opportunities

- O K-5 everyone performs; 3-5 performs twice, chorus performs twice
- O Musical (April 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>) selection tied to equity: everyone can choose to be a part of musical (Newsies Jr. selected for this year based on shows with wide access for students to perform); Marisa Guzman set to do choreography; Anne Cofer from OASIS will assist with crew; looking to increase tech capacity
- Philosophy is to create a safe space for kids to explore dancing
- Update: Took 14 students to audition to all county chorus students have to sing in quartets or trios; 6 kids from Ed Smith received spots
- 2<sup>nd</sup> grade attended Nutcracker; very valuable experience, but very few scenes performed

#### PTO President's Report

- Kari motions to approve minutes; Alex seconds; Nov. meeting minutes approved
- \$500 in additional funding requested for travel and hotel for guest speaker for Black History Month celebration (total of \$1,000, to also cover dancer/choreographer)
  - Sarah Brown: Original \$500 for choreographer needs to be submitted as formal funding request
  - Kari motions to approve request, pending formal submission of funding request for \$500 for dancer/choreographer; Ashley seconds; approved

- For concessions, will continue to discuss how to reduce potential noise/interruptions for concessions at upcoming concerts and musical
- Book giveaway was a success! Will plan for a second this year
